His Excellency and Mrs Le attended the annual event held this year at The Grand Ballroom in Fulham Gardens to thank, congratulate and celebrate longstanding volunteers.

He certainly made his mark with a passionate and heart-warming speech thanking volunteers and acknowledging their role in the community. What left a lasting impression for all was his description of the journey he and Mrs Le took from Vietnam to Pennington! He also linked the dream and vision of our founder Doris Taylor.

At the special luncheon volunteers who in 2014 celebrated; 15, 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, 45, 50 and 60 years of dedicated service to Meals on Wheels in SA, were formally recognised.

Those volunteers achieving 15 years' service were recognised with life membership status in 2014. More than a quarter of our active volunteers are Life Members. His Excellency presented special service awards to those celebrating 40, 50 and 60 year milestones. Volunteer efforts were recognised in the same year that MoWSA reaches a milestone of its own – 60 years of service and contribution to the South Australian community.

MoWSA CEO Sharyn Broer said she was delighted that His Excellency and Mrs Le were able to attend and His Excellency, as Patron, to recognise the ongoing efforts and support of volunteers in MoWSA's 60th year.

"Our annual Awardee Day is an opportunity to publicly acknowledge the extraordinary efforts of our inspiring volunteers," she said. "It is another opportunity for us to come together and pay tribute to their dedication, support and admirable work they continue to do

in local communities across the State. "Without the help of volunteers, Meals on Wheels wouldn't be possible. In addition to preparing and or delivering a delicious nourishing three-course meal, our volunteers offer a friendly smile, social contact and a check that clients are "Safe & Well". "They are the driving force behind our service, and as MoWSA continues to move forward during its 60th year, we hope to continue to play an integral part of communities across SA.

The Annual Pageant and Awardee Day, signal that the festive season is underway and that Meals on Wheels across the state has planned Christmas menus, prepared the frozen meal orders and the advanced planning for deliveries is done. And of course many branches have planned parties and events for volunteers and clients.

But this Christmas is a little more special for us...it's our 60th!

Inestimable volunteer hours have prepared and delivered some 47 million meals since we started and Meals on Wheels has assisted thousands of people to enjoy a longer, happier and more independent lifestyle in their own homes.

The recent Awardee Day enabled us to salute the work of all of our almost 8500 volunteers, but especially the 580 people who became Life Members after 15 years of service, or were celebrating 5 year volunteer service milestones thereafter. This is not only one-way traffic though. Those who receive Meals on Wheels also give. The friendly chat, the word of thanks, the participation in research and general feedback from clients, makes our work worthwhile.

MoWSA has been busy in all sorts of ways across the organisation this

year. Our 60th has been an opportune time for us to review our work and purpose as we look to the future. Inputs from research, roundtables, regional conferences and more, has been reviewed by the Board and Management and this has led to the development of the strategic plan that will guide us for the next 5 years. We have begun and will continue to share this work with all stakeholders, as we embark on our future journey together.

I am delighted with the positive feedback from volunteers that shows our branch support structure, really has been providing the right help at the right time and place.

Of course the continued roll out of our choice program is also a delight, for both clients and volunteers, once in place at branches.

One area worthy of mention is our work on what we refer to as "green initiatives". A number of kitchens have been part of a pilot study involving solar energy.

Many more have engaged in green waste programs and of course our new packaging is recyclable with the exception of the card lids. We have taken the 'think global/act local' approach to doing our bit for the environment.

We have also been busy planning the Australian Meals on Wheels National Conference, to be held in Adelaide next September. As hosts, we look forward to seeing many volunteers at this event, which will offer an interesting array of speakers and topics as well as social occasions.

It really has been a busy year, but I guess that's the way it's been at Meals on Wheels for all of our 60 years.

May I offer all those involved in Meals on Wheels SA, a blessed, safe and peaceful Christmas and New Year. We look forward to working with you again in 2015.


